

TERMS & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The Tasmanian Hockey Centre is a **strictly no smoking** venue.

The Tasmanian Hockey Centre is a licensed venue. **No alcohol** is permitted to be brought in or taken from the venue, and the venue reserves the right to refuse entry to, or have removed, any intoxicated person.

It is **an offence for minors to purchase or consume alcohol**, or for a person to supply alcohol to a minor.

Any behaviour deemed unsociable, dangerous, or detrimental to the experience of other users of the venue by centre management will result in eviction from the venue.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

The following items are not permitted in the Tasmanian Hockey Centre:

Illegal substances including controlled, dangerous or illicit drugs

Incendiary devices (flares, fireworks and smoke bombs)

Firearms and explosives, chemical, radioactive or biological substances

Laser lights

Animals (other than Assistance Dogs)

Bicycles, scooters, skateboards and rollerblades/skates

Camera Tripods

Glass (including bottles) or cans and opened drink containers

Unauthorised advertising material or flyers

Any other item that, in the opinion of centre management, could cause harm or public nuisance

Spectator Code of Conduct

As a spectator watching an event that is conducted or sanctioned by Hockey Tasmania, you must meet the following requirements with regard to your conduct.

- 1.** Spectators are an important part of the game and shall at all times conform to accepted standards of good sportsmanship and behaviour.
- 2.** Spectators shall at all times respect officials, coaches and players and extend all courtesies to them.
- 3.** Lead by example and respect all players, coaches, umpires and fellow spectators – physical or verbal abuse will not be tolerated.
- 4.** Respect the umpires' decision. Do not abuse, threaten or intimidate an umpire or match official and do not show dissension, displeasure or disapproval towards an umpire or match official's decision in an abusive or unreasonable fashion.
- 5.** Support skilled performances and show respect for opposition teams and players.
- 6.** Display appropriate social behaviour by not using profane, demeaning or derogatory language, or harassing players, coaches, officials or other spectators.
- 7.** Leave the spectator area tidy and free from litter.
- 8.** Do not ridicule mistakes or losses – supporters are there to support.
- 9.** Acknowledge all volunteers who are giving up their valuable time to enable the conduct of competition.
- 10.** Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
